Parent/Carer's agreement with the school

I/we will:

- ◆ get to know about my child's life at school and become involved in the daily life of the school;
- ◆ ensure my child comes to school each school day, arriving by 8.55am, properly equipped;
- ◆ not leave my child unsupervised on the school premises before 8.50am;
- ◆ inform the school by 9.30am if my child is not able to attend school that day due to illness;
- ◆ inform the school in writing at the beginning of the day if collection arrangements will be different to that agreed on the school 'Permission Form';
- ◆ avoid taking my child out of school during term time. (I/we understand that any leave of absence must be granted by the Headteacher in advance);
- ◆ let the school know as soon as possible of any problems which might affect my child's work or behaviour;
- ◆ encourage my child to wear school uniform and discourage unsuitable hairstyles, footwear and jewellery.
- ◆ read with my child daily and support them with homework and learning activities ;
- ◆ attend the termly Parent Consultation Evenings and discussions about my child's progress;
- ◆ attend meetings arranged for parents/carers e.g. curriculum evenings, meetings with the school nurse;
- ◆ support school policies, rules and organisation;
- ◆ actively support the Parents' and Friends' Association;

- ◆ come to school every day by 8.55am;
- ◆ bring the things I need and look after them properly;
- ◆ wear my uniform and be tidy;
- ◆ work hard and do all my class and homework as well as I can;
