





Dear Parents/ Carers

We are so looking forward to seeing you all on Monday. This feels like it might be the first step towards some normality, which we are all desperate for. We are thankful for all you have done in supporting your child/children with remote learning this term. We know the challenges many of you have faced, juggling work with home learning. The information on page two are reminders of all the procedures within our risk assessments, that must remain in place. These are the same procedures that were in place at the end of the Autumn Term. I want to be very clear that we expect all members of our school community to adhere to the existing guidelines. We ask that parents and carers wear masks correctly and adhere to social distancing guidelines. Please do not come into the school building via the front office unless absolutely necessary and with the exception of Catkin Class parents/ carers, we ask you to remain behind the school gate for dropping off and collecting your child/ children.

Attendance is mandatory from Monday 8th March 2021, so unless we see a letter advising your child to shield, we expect to see all children in school. We will be ready to welcome them with (socially distanced) open arms!

PE

PE will continue to be on a Tuesday for all children and will take place outside for the remainder of the year. Children should continue to come to school dressed in weather appropriate clothing that enables them to move freely. This is expected to be their usual PE kits as the weather gets warmer.

My Coyle will continue to lead PE for all classes, ensuring he stays 2-metres from all staff and children who are not in his Acorn Class bubble. He will ensure that each bubble uses separate equipment each week.

School Uniform

We would like the children to wear school uniform, including school shoes, when they return. But due to the fact that the children may have outgrown their Autumn uniform and retail is not yet fully open, children will be able to continue to come to school in non-uniform and may wear suitable alternative footwear. We are expecting another bout of cold weather and so the children need to be dressed in layers, as we continue to keep all doors and windows open for ventilation.

Collective Worship/ Assembly

As per the DfE guidelines, we will not come together as a whole school for assembly and collective worship. Children will remain in their class bubbles for assemblies. We hope that in the summer term, further guidance will allow us to come together as a whole school once again.

Remote Learning

As from Monday 8th March 2021 remote learning will no longer be available to all children. Only children who have been advised to shield or are self-isolating will be able to access remote learning. Please remember to return any Chromebooks that were on loan from the school.

Risk Assessment- Prevention

We are continuing to ensure that the school building is well ventilated with all doors and windows open. We continue to follow guidelines with regard to social distancing between ourselves as staff and in encouraging the children in Key Stage 2 (Acorn and Chestnut Class) to do so too. Visitors to school will be restricted to reduce the risk of transmission of Coronavirus. There are posters displayed at the entrance of the school with guidance for visitors. **Risk assessments have been revised and will be available to view on the school website by Friday 5th March 2021.**

Lateral Flow Testing (Rapid Self Testing)

In January, staff at our school along with colleagues nationwide in Primary Schools, began testing at home twice a week using Lateral Flow Tests. These tests are used to detect asymptomatic COVID-19 cases and are crucial in the fight against the virus. We are grateful that all staff are engaging in the Lateral Flow Testing as testing is not mandatory, but provides another measure to contain the spread of Coronavirus and keep our school community safe.

As we return to school, I am very excited to hear all the stories of bike rides, woodland walks and snow day antics. This time apart I am sure has been testing not only physically but mentally as well. Darker evenings and colder weather can put us off getting outside at times and staying inside can feel safer and certainly warmer.
