To coincide with the book fair that will be visiting the school on Thursday 26th September, we are launching a Reading Challenge to encourage us all to read more books for pleasure. Reading for a short period of time is already part of our home learning policy and we have changed how we read in class, to incorporate more whole class reading of the amazing new stories we have ordered to go with our topics. But reading at home is so important and is also a great way to wind-down together before bedtime.

The reading challenge will encourage you or your child to record in their reading journal/ home learning book when they have read at home. Children will receive rewards for reaching specific milestones in the amount of times they have read (as demonstrated by these wonderful children in the photograph).

Please help us by purchasing books from the book fair as the more you spend, the more we are able to benefit from the books that we purchase for the children.

And don't forget to pick up a book bag for ± 6.10 from the school office if you don't have one.

FLU Vaccinations 2019

This year, all of the children throughout the school are being offered the Influenza Nasal Spray Vaccination. The vaccine offers protection against four strains of the influenza virus. Having the vaccine reduces the circulation of Influenza and can protect our wider community, particularly those for whom Influenza poses a serious health risk.

Please complete the consent form for each of your children and return to school before the 14th October 2019

Nasal vaccinations will be given on the 6th November for all children for whom we have received consent forms.
