English

Reading

The children will be reading, listening to and discussing a range of books including 'The Egyptian Cinderella' and 'Marcy and the Riddle of The Sphinx'.

Writing

The children will be writing their own narrative based on 'The Egyptian Cinderella', writing an explanation text on Mummifying and writing postcards.

<u>SPAG</u>

The children will develop their knowledge of using fronted adverbials, punctuate direct speech and use conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions to express time and cause.

Geography

We will be looking at the River Nile in more detail and examining how it played an important role in Ancient Egypt and its role in modern society. We will be taking an imaginary cruise along the Nile and thinking about what we might see on our journey.

PΕ

Children will continue to apply a broader range of skills, developing an understanding of how to improve in different physical activities. More specifically, through athletics and orienteering they will learn to:

- Develop running, jumping and throwing technique
- Learn about pace in challenges
- Develop orienteering and problem solving skills
- Follow maps and trails
- Work as a team

DT

The children will be making Egyptian Shadufs. A shaduf is a hand-operated machine used to transport water from a lower level to a higher one. It was used by the ancient Egyptians to help water crops. The children will be using their designing and planning skills to create their own Shadufs.

PSHE

During PSHE this half term we will continue to learn about the changes that we experience during puberty but the focus will be on emotional changes and how children can manage feelings and emotions in the context of relationships with those around

RE

The Children will be thinking about what symbols and stories help Jewish people remember their covenant with God?

explanations of the sun and find out how
obelisks were used to tell the time.

Computing

We will be using our computing skills to plan and create our own multimedia presentations, including text, pictures, and sounds, about a particular aspect of Ancient Egyptian life. We will also look at how we can use search engines safely to find out answers to specific questions about Ancient Egypt.
