Make a noise

During anti-bullying week we will be re-launching our online platform 'Tootoot', which enables children in KS2 to 'make a noise' and speak out about bullying. This project is funded by the DfE and we are pleased to be able to offer this initiative to children for the second year. Children will receive a reminder of their log-ins after Anti-Bullying Week.

Each student is given a **username** and **password**, which allows them to log in and use 'Make a noise'. They are then able to access the relevant resources or report incidents directly to myself at school. All users can access the 'Make a noise' site on a mobile, tablet or computer by typing <u>www.makeanoise.info</u>



We will also be continuing to work with our community Prevention Youth Officer, PC Claudine Bishop this term, to educate our KS2 children on Internet Safety as part of our ongoing Personal Social Health and Economic Education curriculum (PSHE).

Whilst we are re-launching Tootoot, we'd also like to remind you to support and encourage your children in KS2 to keep accessing Times Tables RockStars as part of their weekly home learning. Again, we will send out reminders to the children of their username and passwords. We have paid to enable the children to access TimesTables RocksStars App.
