Slindon litter clear up on Saturday 9 March from 10.30 am – meet at The Forge

Can you help us 'spring clean' the village on Saturday 9 March from 10.30am? It would be great if you could join our community by giving a couple of hours of your time to join the teams collecting litter across the village.

On the day

We will all meet outside The Forge by 10.30am. If you live locally and you want to start nearer to your own home and simply bring bags of litter down later that's fine). Our MP, Nick Herbert plans to join us (subject to Parliamentary commitments e.g. Brexit!). We will provide bags and gloves and will divide into teams to pick up litter (but you can of course do your own thing if that suits you better). We'll all bring our full bags of picked litter back to The Forge area BEFORE 3pm (exact spot to be confirmed) and Arun District Council will collect it all up and take it away. As a 'thank you' for your efforts, all participants will receive a voucher for tea/coffee and cake at The Forge. Please note that you take part at your own risk, and children under 16 must be accompanied by a responsible adult. If you can't make the allotted time slot on that day, we hope you will still help by picking up and bin-ing any litter you see. Please DO NOT take any litter to the Forge area after 3pm – otherwise it may miss the Arun collection and become litter again!!

This initiative has been organised by Slindon*Life* with funding support from the Parish Council and invaluable help from the Rubbish & Recycling department at Arun District Council. Many thanks to both.



Mike Imms, is Chairman of SlindonLife (a community group that seeks to address all manner of wants and needs across the village—concentrating on areas that don't fall naturally to other organistions). The following passage has also been published in Slindon Parish Magazine.

We are delighted to have been collaborating with the school, the County Council and Slindon Parish Council to find ways of improving road safety in the village.

The Parish Council took a big step forward some years ago, by persuading the authorities to introduce a 20mph speed limit across the village – including the road past the school.

The Coronation Hall committee have always 'done their bit' in an informal way by taking a relaxed view of parking in the Coronation Hall car park at school times, thereby reducing the pressure on onstreet parking.

We, and all the village take the issue of road safety by the school very seriously and are keen to do whatever we can to support the school in efforts to improve road safety for the children. However, there are a number of things YOU can do to help us in our efforts.

- Act as a 'role model' for villagers (and visitors) by not parking on the white line outside of The Forge. If you drive at 20mph on your approach and departure from the school, then all other vehicles behind you can only travel at 20mph as well.
- Let us know if you see any 'offenders' people parking on the 'white line' opposite the school or in Meadsway, or speeding. If you can let the staff in the school office know, we'll take it up with the people concerned if we possibly can. We would need some basic information such as time, day etc and a description of the vehicle (colour, make, model and ideally registration number). It might be easiest simply to take a quick picture on your phone.

Miss Cooper would like to say a huge thank you to all the fantastic helpers who achieved a great deal (see photo) on Saturday 18th February. With the help of Mark and Rebecca Ford (who have worked with us a lot with the willow structures in the school ground), we cleared the area of shrub land at the front of the school and laid a new hedge. Huge thanks to Mr Martin, Mr Elkin (our governor) and Mrs Clarke for all their hard work. Miss Cooper learnt lots of new skills and smashed her personal best of 18,888 steps!

Whilst our vision is not yet complete, I'm sure you will agree that it looks a great deal better and makes the school more visible.
