## PARENT/CARER INFORMATION MEETINGS THIS TERM

This term we are holding a number of Parent/Carer Information Meetings, as well as the Parent/ Carer consultation evenings which are held towards the end of the Spring term.

Two of these meetings are for Parents/Carers of children in Year 2 and Year 6. A KS1 SATS meeting will be held in the Glade from 3-3.30pm on Wednesday 17th January (for parents/carers of children in Year 2).

A KS2 SATS meeting will be held in the Glade from 3-3.30pm on Thursday18th January (for parents/carers of children in Year 6).

We very much hope that Parents and Carers of Year 2 and Year 6 children will be able to attend these meetings. It is so important that you understand and share the message that we communicate to the children

with regard to SATS and that we use the same language. If you are unable to attend, please let me know and I will arrange a different, mutually convenient time.

If you do not have children in either year group but are still interested, you are very welcome to attend.

I hope all Parents/Carers will be able to attend one of the meetings on Tuesday 6th February where we would like to share with you the changes that have been made since the OfSTED judgement of 'Requires Improvement' in January 2017.

Parent/ Carer Consultations will be held on Monday 12th and Wednesday 14th March to discuss individual progress of your children.

#### VACANCIES AT SLINDON C OF E PRIMARY SCHOOL

This term we are interviewing for two new permanent members of staff. On December 15th an advert for a Premises Manager and a permanent Teacher for Acorn Class went live on the West Sussex Jobs site.

The deadline for applications for a Premises Manager is today (Friday 12th January). However, please do spread the word, particularly to people local to the school and do come and see me if either yourself or someone you know may be interested in the position.

#### **HEADLICE**

We had a number of cases of head lice towards the end of last term. Head lice can be difficult to spot, even when the head is closely inspected. They are very small whitish or grey-brown insects that range from the size of a pinhead to the size of a sesame seed.

The only way to be sure someone has head lice is to find a live louse by combing their hair with a special fine-toothed comb. This is called detection combing. We recommend that all families follow the motto of 'Once a week, take a peek', using a specific detection comb, or 'nit comb'.

To help prevent the spread of head lice:

- Comb your child's hair regularly with a nit or bug-busting comb. You can buy these from your local pharmacist;
- Periodically inspect the hair of all the children in the family;
- Do not be embarrassed to tell the parents of any other children who may have had head-to-head contact with your child.
- Thank other parents if they let you know that their child has lice.

This week I will be talking to the school council about attendance as I'm disappointed that already our attendance is below the national average.

From next week, teachers will be taking each class register electronically and this will be completed by 9am. If your child is absent please telephone the school office to let us know, before 9.30am.
